- OUR HISTORY -

Mandurah Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC), originally named Peel SLSC, commenced operation in 1996 at Halls Head as a junior development club. In 1999 the expanding club relocated to San Remo to accommodate a maturing development. During 2000 the club under a new management committee, was renamed Mandurah SLSC and relocated to Port Bouvard. In 2002 low numbers resulted in Mandurah SLSC going into recession for a season.

Mandurah SLSC was resurrected and reformed in 2003 at Town Beach by members of the original administration group. Membership grew and the club later relocated to San Remo again. A breakaway group started as Port Bouvard SLSC in December 2003.

Mandurah progressed from a probationary club to an affiliated club of Surf Life Saving WA in 2005. The club was awarded third place in Club of the Year by Surf Life Saving WA in 2006 and second place in the Laerdal Patrol Club of the Year in 2009.

The City of Mandurah, after an exhaustive survey of beach locations within the city precincts, identified and approved San Remo as the site for a Surf Life Saving Club building in July 2005. In 2006 a community working group was formed and a Master Plan developed. The Master Plan included Concept building plans.

In 2008 Mandurah SLSC secured funding from LotteryWest and Department of Sport and Recreation CSRFF for a clubhouse. Further funding was secured later from the Royalties for Region Scheme and the City of Mandurah and funding is now in place for clubhouse construction.

Final Architect Building Plans have recently been completed and building is expected to commence in early 2012.

- PRESIDENT'S REPORT -

The 2010/11 season and our 14th since inception was another one of fun in the sand and surf. Final plans are now being developed for our much anticipated club building project that should commence next season. Thank you to Ian Daniels for his work in this area.

The season commenced with our dedicated committee, volunteer surf life savers, age group managers and many other volunteers coming together at our first club day and open day in October.

Beach conditions were relatively mild during summer with volunteer surf life savers conducting numerous preventative actions a small number of rescues and first aid treatments and a search for two sharks in January. We welcomed a new group of surf life savers and a group of cadets who progressed to surf rescue awards towards the end of the season. The club is proud of your achievements.

During January the Westpac Rescue Helicopter visited our beach with a rescue demonstration followed by a landing on the beach. A crowd turned out together with a gathering of VIP's for the display. Paul Turnor's The Good Guys sponsored an intra nipper carnival in February and The Good Guys commenced support via the Good Guys Foundation during the season.

The Southern Beaches Alliance an alliance between Mandurah, Port Bouvard, Secret Harbour and Coogee was revisited. This is an alliance to better promote surf life saving in the region, encourage the clubs to work together and is an effective means of reducing duplication and work load and creating economies of scale. Thank you to Southern Beaches Alliance Clubs for all your help.

We have enjoyed great support from many sponsors again this season. Thank you to some of the major sponsors The Good Guys Mandurah, Westpac, Telstra, Alcoa, Lotterywest, Peel Development Commission and Royalties for Regions and the City Of Mandurah. Please support our sponsors and all the local businesses in Mandurah that have helped us during the season.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members all the volunteer surf life savers, age group managers, other volunteers, helpers and members who have contributed to the club over the past season.

- VICE PRESIDENT and CLUBHOUSE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT -

The past 12 months has been very exciting for the future of the Club with the City of Mandurah committing to the construction of our long awaited clubhouse.

This has come about because all the funding has now been secured with the final funding split being set out below:

It has taken many years to attract the appropriate support and funding for this project but it now appears that it is a reality. The City of Mandurah has now engaged an architect and the full design process has begun in earnest. We have met with the architect and City representatives and the preliminary designs are looking fantastic with the architects coming up with some great ideas!

This phase of the project is scheduled for completion no later than September 2011. The advertising of Tenders for the actual construction will follow and this process is scheduled to be finished by the end of 2011 with the actual construction commencing in early 2012.

The next 2 summer seasons will be the most exciting seasons in the Club's history with our "Home" finally becoming a reality! And those sundowners are going to be just the best.

- DIRECTOR OF LIFE SAVING REPORT -

2010 -2011 was my first season as director of life saving and what will no doubt be the first of many. With the support of the present committee my initiation was very smooth and hassle free and a big thank you to those past and present.

Many new faces this season achieved outstanding results not only in achieving their certification but of bronze medallions, surf rescue certificates and advanced resuscitation but also personal development. It is of extreme importance that our club promote and train the next generation of life savers very heavily as it is for this reason that we even exist as a Surf Life Saving Club. The value of a life quite simply can't have a dollar value placed on it and it is the life savers on our beach that volunteer through those summer months that makes a safe swimming environment for the public.

My ultimate goal for the coming season is to provide a stepping stone to achieve additional training, qualifications and personal growth for this next generation of life savers. By doing this we will have greater retention of life savers and a better system to which we will need in place prior to the opening of our new club.

By the end of season 2011 though the hard work of training the current group of life savers we were able to have in excess of 20 qualified and trained life guards on the beach each weekend over the last 4 weeks of the season. This was a great result and will enable us to implement a two team patrol roster for the coming season and again allow for people to not feel over burdened with what is a voluntary organization.

The coming season will see members being placed in further qualifications such as IRB Drivers, Crew man certificates and ATV training along with many other awards. The elevation of junior club members into delegation roles and being promoted to official titles will again help in the future development of our life savers.

It's a daunting step up from patrol member to a patrol captain or vice captain but these steps need to be implemented in order to give a pathway to success and future development of the club. Over the next 2 years we will be needing more additional patrolling members with the view to have approximately 6-8 patrols with each consisting of the required regulatory certificates to establish those patrols. No doubt that with the unveiling of the new club house all these endeavours will be met much more easily but with the right preparation in place the burden of the few currently in the committee this will be spread.

The 2010 – 2011 season saw in excess of 25 newly awarded members and to build on that in the coming season will be a challenge. Member's awards ranged from Surf Rescue Certificates, Bronze Medallions, Advanced Resuscitation & IRB Drivers

Our equipment needs have been boosted by the addition of new 6 new boards for the nippers to train and compete with this year and our patrolling equipment will remain virtually unchanged over the coming season with the view to add further addition equipment once the new club house facilities are complete.

- TRAINING OFFICERS REPORT -

The season commenced with a good turnout for Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion training. With a high number of candidates, courses were difficult to deliver with only limited help from other members namely Dane Stanley, Warwick Webb, Amy Piercy and Glyn Moorey.

The club needs more trainers qualified and helpers to assist with training so as to increase courses offered, which will then mean we have more qualified people available on rosters to provide life saving services which is key to any clubs existence. Next season I would like to see more Bronze Medallion holders willing to do their training instructors award to help in a very rewarding role, 'Training our future'.

Thank you to all the parents who put the time into their children to allow them to attend training, and hopefully in the not to distant future we will have a real training room, not the back of my house or the shed.

A big thank you needs to go to Port Bouvard SLSC, who allowed us to have an overnight training camp at their club- house and thank you to their Assessor Steve Heron for helping with our mock assessments and training.

Our proficiencies for this season were completed successfully with a 100% pass rate, giving us the largest number of proficient patrolling members on the books in the clubs history. What a fantastic effort and achievement.

This has been a tough season for me as the Education Officer with state centre being audited to ensure WA meets ATQF requirements. This meant that all clubs in WA were put under the microscope to ensure that all their paperwork and teaching methods were up to the standards required, we passed with flying colours. I believe the fact that we have such a good working relationship with Secret Harbour SLSC and Port Bouvard SLSC has helped us to keep up-to-date with all the new guidelines.

We will need to ensure that we fill out all the necessary paperwork and deliver the same high level of instructing we have been delivering and attend all the training instructor proficiency courses during the upcoming season.

Our training equipment is in reasonable condition but, with the constant use from our senior and junior club members, it needs ongoing repair and replacement to maintain safety standards.

Our club can pride its self in always having the most up-to-date training equipment, but this comes at a price. We need more funds to allow us to keep maintaining standards. Sponsorship and grant application is critical for this.

This season saw a fantastic Surf Rescue Certificate pass rate of approx 10 candidates and a further 12 Bronze Medallion candidates successfully complete their awards, well done.

Next season we need more members to step-up and realise what a healthy lifestyle Surf Life Saving has to offer, and step-up to undertake their Surf Rescue Certificate or Bronze Medallion award.

It has never been easier to train for an award with the new on-line training program, allowing you to complete the theory components within the comfort of your own home, at a time that works for you.

With the high number of SRC and BM award holders within the club now, I hope to see a strong number of cadets and up (13yrs and over) wanting to compete this coming year as I will now be changing my focus to competitions.

The club has a strong history of competing and proudly has a number of members who have won state medals in previous years. It's time to show them what we got again!

- PROMOTIONS OFFICERS REPORT -

This year has been a busy year for our small but active Club in many ways. Our AGM in August was a new concept and success on Bouvard Boat Cruises which is on again this year on the 27th August at 5.30pm. Also in August our Club received \$500 from Woolworths "Go for Fresh" Grant. October 17th was our first day of the season with an Open Day supported by Westpac Forum Branch who supplied and manned a beach BBQ by their staff. October also saw our Beach Clean-up day supported by Bakers Delight.

October through to February was a massive boost to our Club when Georgina Webb with the help of Dane Stanley succeeded in 10 Club members attain their Surf Rescue Certificates and 12 Club members attain their Bronze Medallions. A 100% pass rate typifying Georgina's commitment and our club member's spirit to succeed. Their final assessments where part of a sleep over at the Port Bouvard SLSC in February followed by a Ten Pin Bowling wind-up for all to celebrate in March.

In early December I participated in my first "Street Appeal Day" in the CBD. It is easy to see that our young members certainly manage to get the public to donate freely more so than our older members. Hopefully more parents will stand with their young children in club uniform this year even for just an hour or two and have some fun. We raised nearly \$1,700 on the day. December also was our National Boardies Day with again fabulous support from the Mandurah Baptist College holding a Free Dress Day along with a sausage sizzle for the students raising in excess of \$2,000. Boardies on-line campaign also raised \$1,055 bringing us in 8th overall in Australia. Looking at the results I believe we could get as far as 2nd in Australia next year with a little more support.

Early January started with Warwick Webb organising a full rescue display by Westpac Rescue Helicopter followed by most of the Club crawling in and around the chopper in the park. Late January was our Bunning's Sausage Sizzle Day manned by the usual hard core members followed up with two sausage sizzle Sundays in our local park after hungry kids and parents came up off the beach. These 3 BBQ's raised around \$1,200. On our Bunning's Day Kasey Sturgess decided to rattle a donation can in and around the store to raise a further \$378.

Early February was definite winner with major sponsor Good Guys Mandurah sponsoring a surf carnival with many prizes received by our young nippers. Thanks to Paul Turnor and his staff. In October Good Guys Mandurah also supplied all products for a BBQ at their store over the week-end which raised over \$900.

Sunday 3rd April was our last Club day for the season followed by the Nippers Wind up party at Henry Sutton Park. All nippers ate, drank, swam and received their Certificates. In May it was time for the SLSC Annual Ball at the Hyatt Hotel when Georgina was nominated for "Trainer of the Year" award. I've got to say she should have won it easily — what were they thinking! It would be great to see more members attend this Gala Night of Celebration next year. End of May was a fun filled Wind up at the Hyundai Stadium for the 13's and over and patrol members. Lots of awards and recognition for our young life savers organized by Georgina, a great night had by young and old!!

Also during the year we finalised our first Club Flag, purchased new beach Caps for age groups to wear and were introduced by Elaine Daniels to an excellent selection of Club Shirts, rashies and beach merchandise showing off our new club logo.

I would like acknowledge Thomas Polinelli – Surf Life Saver of the year, Amy Piercy Junior Life Saver & Junior Achiever, Jake Webb – Patrol Service, Mark and Michelle Piercy – Club Person and Ian Daniels, who is ALSO our Clubhouse Chairman, along with Warwick Webb will take us from our "OLD TIN HOUSE" to our "NEW PENTHOUSE".


